#### Gate 3

#### Secondary School Sports Day, Thursday 5th October

EYFS TA



#### Language of the Month - Dhivehi

During September and October we will be celebrating Dhivehi as our language of the month. We began with assemblies, learning about the Dhivehi language and the culture of Dhivehi speakers. We learnt, for example, that Dhivehi is spoken in the Maldives, and that the Maldives are an archipelago in the Indian ocean. We also learnt that the Maldives is the second least populated country in Asia,



after Brunei, and is the lowest lying country in the world (Vilingili, the highest point in the Maldives, is only 2.4 metres above sea level!). A really big thank you to Lara, who gave a fantastic assembly, helping me explain some things about Maldivian culture (we learnt that Gulha, a type of spicy fried fish dumpling, is Lara's favourite food from the Maldives and that there is no Dhivehi word for goodbye, instead they say "I'm going" (Dhanee)

After half term we will be celebrating Japanese. If any of our Japanese families would like to get involved, or if you have any new ideas, please let us know!
