## SECONDARY

### Form Teachers/Tutors for Academic Year 2020-21

Dear Parents,

We think carefully before allocating Form teachers/tutors as this is a role of fundamental importance in all schools but one that also is particularly important for the BCG Secondary School at this moment in time. We are establishing a culture of academic rigour within an environment of trust, respect and kindness towards others. All students are expected to take personal responsibility for their learning and the Form teachers will support and encourage them towards this goal with an approach which is often called 'tough love'. The duties of the role are diverse, but the pastoral element is key. Tutors should know their students and the families, and be there to support and advise.

The role involves:

#### Managing Administration

Morning registration involves taking the register and checking that uniform is correct and ongoing administrative tasks. Absences should be noticed and followed up as necessary, lateness observed, commented upon, and followed up as necessary.

#### Making Connections with home

Form teachers are the first point of contact for parents and are expected to get to know the families of the students

#### Be aware of issues

As one of the adults that students see most regularly, form tutors are in a good place to spot when there are any issues or difficulties. They also keep in regular contact with all subject teachers and have an overview of the situation for each student.

#### Build an ethos

Form teachers play a crucial role in building a positive culture (socially, culturally and in terms of the class values). In the best of cases, form classes can come to feel like an extended family.


